**Discovery Expedition of St. Charles to Camp at Kaw Point**

The Discovery Expedition of St. Charles will camp at the Lewis and Clark Historic Park at Kaw Point June 26 through 29, 2004, reenacting the historic stay of the Lewis and Clark Expedition in 1804. The Discovery Expedition of St. Charles, Missouri, is a nonprofit organization dedicated to rediscovering the legacy of Lewis and Clark. Each year the Discovery Expedition reenacts a portion of the original river journey, from Elizabeth, Pennsylvania, where the keelboat was built in 1803, to Great Falls, Montana, beyond which the original boats could not proceed. They are official reenactors for the waterway portion of the national Lewis and Clark bicentennial commemoration. Traveling in handcrafted replicas of Lewis and Clark's keelboat and pirogues and wearing authentic period dress, crew members portray specific individuals from the original expedition. Crew members include several descendents of members of the original expedition.

Their goal is to provide a rich and genuine living history experience, not only to the expedition members but, more importantly, to the public. They promote education and the study of American history and heritage through discussions and living history demonstrations.
